



# Questions To Ask Your Children Surrounding Pornography

Sometimes anxiety can get in the way of having important conversations with your children. Asking questions can help alleviate some of the fear that comes from discussing pornography with your kids. It then gives opportunity to participate in a dialogue that allows you to share your thoughts and values.

The questions below are meant to only be a guide. Also, they might need changing depending on the age of your child. Remember that not knowing the answer is okay! Sometimes that best response you can give is, "I don't know but let's find out together." Always be sure your answers are honest and accurate.

<b>If I say the word "pornography" do you know what that means?</b>	<b>Does pornography fit into the larger plan God has created for sex?</b>	<b>What might you do if you ever saw pornography?</b>
<b>What do you hear your friends saying about pornography?</b>	<b>What are some reasons why you think it would be best to stay away from pornography?</b>	<b>Why do you think someone would be curious about pornography?</b>



**Is there anything confusing about our conversations surrounding pornography?**

**What's the best way for me (as your parent) to help when you have been exposed or have seen pornography?**

**Have you ever hopped on your phone/computer looking for something, but something else like pornography popped up?**

**Would you be willing to share with me if you ever see something like this? If not, is there something I could do that would allow for me to be a safe place to share?**

**What are some different ways or places we might run into pornography? Have you thought about how you might avoid those situations or how you might get away if you find yourself in a situation where pornography is present?**

**Since the last time we talked, have you seen anything like what we've been talking about?**
